




All books placed in the top 20 on the New York Times Bestseller List as of September 15, 2013, and are listed in order of popularity.

We have four library branches, and not all books are at all four. A listing of branches that carry each book appears at the end of the description.




10. **A Dance with Dragons**, by George R.R. Martin. Book 5 of "A Song of Ice and Fire." ALL BRANCHES



1. **The Liberty Amendments**, by Mark R. Levin. The talk-radio host offers 11 proposals for returning to America's founding principles. ALL BRANCHES




