Protect your money! Many have heard that the South Carolina Department of Revenue was the victim of the worst cyber attack against a state tax agency in the nation.

Now, South Carolina wants to make sure that its residents don't pay the price. For taxpayers, the state is funding identity-protection and credit monitoring services from Experian for one year. But people must register for this service. In the interest of reaching as many citizens as possible, the state government is partnering with local public libraries to inform individuals of this opportunity to safeguard their personal data.

"Public libraries across South Carolina are making sure directions are available and easy to access," said Georgetown County Library Director Dwight McInvaill. "We encourage taxpayers to access soon the registering posted on our website and Facebook page. We are providing written brochures in every library branch. This is an urgent matter."
