





We have four library branches, and not all books are at all four. A listing of branches that carry each book appears at the end of the description.



8. **Gone Girl**, by Gillian Flynn. A woman disappears on her fifth anniversary; is her husband a killer? ALL BRANCHES




11. **The Husband's Secret**, by Liane Moriarty. A woman's life is upended when she discovers a letter she was not meant to read. ALL BRANCHES
