1. **Invisible**, by James Patterson and David Ellis. Searching for her sister's killer, a former F.B.I. researcher a link between score of apparently unconnected unsolved cases. Now she must convince her boss and her former boyfriend that this killer is real. ALL BRANCHES

6. **All the Light We Cannot See**, by Anthony Doerr. The lives of a blind French girl and a gadget-obsessed German boy before and during World War II. ALL BRANCHES
7. **The Hurricane Sisters**, by Dorothea Benton Frank. Three generations of women endure a stormy summer in South Carolina's Lowcountry. ALL BRANCHES
8. **The Matchmaker**, by Elin Hilderbrand. A Nantucket resident's life is shaken by a diagnosis and the return to the island of her high school sweetheart. ALL BRANCHES
9. **The One and Only**, by Emily Griffin. A woman who has grown up and made her life in a small, football-obsessed Texas town begins to expand her horizons. ALL BRANCHES
