





All books placed in the top 15 on the New York Times Bestseller List as of August 9, 2015, and are listed in order of popularity.

We have four library branches, and not all books are at all four. A listing of branches that carry each book appears at the end of the description.





2. **The Girl On The Train**, by Paula Hawkins. A psychological thriller set in London is full of complications and betrayals. ALL BRANCHES







9. **Memory Man**, by David Baldacci. A police detective uses his extraordinary memory when tackling the case of his family's murder. ALL BRANCHES


10. **Radiant Angel**, by Nelson DeMille. A surveillance expert monitors the activities of a newly resurgent Russia. ALL BRANCHES


