




All books placed in the top 20 on the New York Times Bestseller List as of September 21, 2014, and are listed in order of popularity.




4. **The Husband's Secret**, by Liane Moriarty. A woman's life is upended when she discovers a letter she was not meant to read. ALL BRANCHES

7. **The Invention of Wings**, by Sue Monk Kidd. The relationship between a wealthy Charleston girl, Sarah Grimke, who will grow up to become a prominent abolitionist, and the slave she is given for her 11th birthday. ALL BRANCHES


