






All books placed in the top 16 on the New York Times Bestseller List as of November 20, 2016, and are listed in order of popularity.

FICTION

1. **Two by Two**, by Nicholas Sparks. A man who became a single father when his marriage and business collapsed learns to take a chance on a new love. ALL BRANCHES
2. **Small Great Things**, by Jodi Picoult. A medical crisis entangles a black nurse, a white supremacist father and a white lawyer. ALL BRANCHES
3. **The Woman in Cabin 10**, by Ruth Ware. A travel writer on a cruise is certain she has heard a body thrown overboard, but no one believes her. WACCAMAW ONLY
4. **All the Light We Cannot See**, by Anthony Doerr. The lives of a blind French girl and a gadget-obsessed German boy before and during World War II. ALL BRANCHES
5. **Commonwealth**, by Ann Patchett. Five decades in the lives of two families—parents, children, siblings, stepchildren—remade by divorce. ALL BRANCHES
6. **Home**, by Harlan Coben. Myron Bolivar and his friend Win locate a boy who was kidnapped 10 years earlier; the 11th Myron Bolivar novel. ALL BRANCHES
7. **The Underground Railroad**, by Colson Whitehead. A slave girl heads toward freedom on the network, envisioned as actual tracks and tunnels. ALL BRANCHES
8. **Truly Madly Guilty**, by Liane Moriarty. Three couples at a backyard barbecue gone wrong. ALL BRANCHES

1. **Killing the Rising Sun**, by Bill O'Reilly and Martin Dugard. The host of "The O'Reilly Factor" recounts the final years of World War II. GEORGETOWN, WACCAMAW
2. **The Magnolia Story**, by Chip Gaines and Joanna Gaines with Mark Dago-stino. The lives of the couple who star in the HGTV show "Fixer Upper." WACCAMAW ONLY
3. **Born to Run**, by Bruce Springsteen. The singer-songwriter's autobiography. GEORGETOWN, WACCAMAW
4. **Hillbilly Elegy**, by J.D. Vance. A Yale Law School graduate looks at the struggles of America's white working class through his own childhood in the Rust Belt. GEORGETOWN, WACCAMAW

7. **The Hidden Life of Trees**, by Peter Wohlleben. A forester presents scientific research on the way trees interact with one another. A best seller in Germany. GEORGETOWN, WACCAMAW
8. **Filthy Rich**, by James Patterson and John Connolly with Tim Malloy. The story of a South Florida financier convicted of soliciting sex from underage girls. ALL BRANCHES
9. **The Book of Joy**, by Dalai Lama and Desmond Tutu. A discussion between two spiritual leaders about how to find joy in the face of suffering. GEORGETOWN ONLY
10. **A Life Well Played**, by Arnold Parmer. Stories of career and relationships by the great golfer, who died in September 2016. GEORGETOWN ONLY
11. **The Girl with the Lower Back Tattoo**, by Amy Schumer. Humorous personal essays by the comedian, actor and writer. WACCAMAW ONLY
12. **Love Warrior**, by Glennon Doyle Melton. After her husband confesses to multiple infidelities, a woman who has overcome bulimia and alcoholism struggles to grow—and so does he. GEORGETOWN, WACCAMAW
